FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQs):

1. What is the teacher to students ratio?

Currently, we have 1 teacher to 16 students ratio.

2. How many days of school are there at Basic Steps Academy?

There are 194 instructional days from August 29 to June 19 with a 10-day winter break at the end of December. We do not schedule mid-winter and spring breaks like many schools.

3. How long is the day for kindergartners and first graders?

Both kindergartners and first graders start at 8:30am. However, kindergartners have a shorter day and are released at 1pm every day (4hrs and 30mins). First graders have a longer day and are released at 2pm every day (5hrs and 30mins).

4. When do students have a break during the school year?

Children will not have school on holidays and during the 10-day winter break. If you have vacations planned, please notify the teacher in writing through email.

5. Do children have recess at school?

We do not have recess scheduled for our kindergarten and 1st grade program because our schedule is shorter than most schools. However, we have 45-minute snack and discussion time in the morning and 30-minute PE fun time with students every day in the afternoon. Our students will get all the fun they need in a 4-5 hours school day.

6. Are there days off for parents' conferences and teacher training?

No. Children are expected to attend school every day except on those 8 holidays and during winter break. We do not have late-start or early-release days like public schools. Parents' conferences are usually scheduled around 8:20am or 11:40am.

7. What is the refund policy?

We do not offer refunds. Parents may withdraw the child from school at any time. However, all fees and tuition collected are nonrefundable.

8. When is tuition due? And how do you collect the tuition?

Parents pay their tuition by the 15th of each month. There will be \$15 late payment fee. Parents are expected to submit their payment electronically or by mails every month. Parents who choose to pay in person must include \$15 inconvenience fee per each transaction.
